The typewriters were not electric in this era, nor were they equipped with correction tape. The Worker at this time had over 88,000 subscribers.

Mrs. Mclean, served as a graphic designer, creating stationary, posters, flyers, tickets, for the PNBC Midwinter Board Meeting, Regional Meetings, and also Annual Session. Upon leaving PNBC, full time, she worked remotely as the editor of the Worker Magazine.

Mrs. Linda James began her employment in 1979, as a clerk to assist with the typing of labels and preparing for the shipping of the books to the customers. She and Mrs. McLean were key employees in helping to build and manage the database for The Worker. Ms. James also assisted with managing the subscription orders and manually recording contact and payment information contact. Mrs. James has a servant's heart. She rises to the occasion in whatever areas she is called upon to help. Currently she plays a key role in day to day administrative functions at PNBC Headquarters

Ms. Patricia Diggs began her work with PNBC as a consultant.
